What will it achieve?

By training to teach with the L.E.A.D. Urban Teaching School Alliance you will gain:

- A PGCE from the University of Nottingham
- Qualified Teacher Status
- Up to 60 Master's credits (towards a 180 credit MA Education degree)
- The development of the unique skills and attributes needed to teach in vibrant urban settings, through involvement with our Urban Curriculum.

We offer initial teacher training, in partnership with the University of Nottingham, for both primary and secondary phases. Our website details the subjects we are recruiting for currently.



Entry Requirements - Primary

You are required to hold a UK degree or equivalent qualification

GCSE English Language and Mathematics at grade C or above

GCSE Science at grade C or above

What does it involve?

You will be placed in a school within our Alliance and follow that school's calendar, working in the school for four days per week. You will also follow the timetable at the University, which includes attending the University each Friday.

In addition, students training within our Alliance can access our Urban Curriculum for one afternoon session each half term. This is an excellent opportunity to learn as part of a professional cohort of teachers beginning training in an urban setting.

How do I apply?

Initial Teacher Training Application Process

Trainee

- Visit UCAS Teacher Training
- Search for 'L.E.A.D. Urban Teaching School Alliance' (Alliance Code 1DK)
- Follow the application process completely, ensuring you submit it
- Book your Professional Skills Test

University

- Application forms are received by the University of Nottingham
- Applications are screened and successful candidates are invited for a University interview
- If successful at the University interview, the candidate's details are forwarded to the L.E.A.D. Urban Teaching School Alliance

L.E.A.D.

- Candidate applications are reviewed by the L.E.A.D. Urban Teaching School Alliance
- Successful candidates are contacted by the Alliance and notified of the details of the interview and the school-based activity
- Following the interview, candidates are informed of the outcome of their interview

University

- University confirms the offer and updates the UCAS system
- University maintains regular contact with trainees

Trainee

- Trainees will be informed of their host school and given contact details in order to arrange a school visit before the end of term
- Trainees will attend the L.E.A.D. Urban Teaching School Alliance Induction Event in July 2019
- The course commences in August 2019; the University will send details
